Good afternoon, team,

By the end of today, all Florida offices should be prepared for Hurricane Helene. The storm is expected to enter the Gulf of Florida tomorrow afternoon as a Category 3 Hurricane, with the potential to strengthen before landfall. It is forecasted to make landfall in the Big Bend area, affecting Steinhatchee, Cedar Keys, Perry, and Tallahassee, before moving northwest into Georgia.

Be prepared for heavy rainfall, winds up to 110 mph, significant coastal and inland flooding, high storm surges (10-15 feet), and tornadoes across Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, and Kentucky. Please ensure that all equipment is secured but ready for deployment if needed. If you are in an affected area, stay in close communication with your managers, check in regularly, and prioritize your safety as well as that of your family and pets.


